The Healthcare Challenge

Back pain is the most commonly reported health condition in Ireland 80% of Irish adults experience back pain at some point in their life. Back pain is estimated to cost the country more than cancer and diabetes treatments combined. The economic burden of low back pain is estimated to be around £2.8 hillion in the LIK ner year Previous research found that disability payments for back pain amounted to €348 million per year, and 27% of people who receive income support do so due to low back pain (LBP), making it the highest single reason for people claiming income support.

People with persistent back pain are often referred to an orthopaedic specialist, this wait can be up to four years and even when seen, less than 10% require surgery, with the remaining 90% discharged back in to primary care, delaying their engagement with physiotherapy.

Various approaches to diagnose, treat and manage LBP have arisen, leading to an exponential increase in health care costs. Attempts in recent decades to treat back pain by treating the spine leaf through injections or surgery have had only marginal success.
